Abstract compiling the most important elements, which shall not exceed 100 words. From 3 to 6 keywords shall be included, which do not coincide with the title.

Coordinators of Migration & Economics issue:

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RULES FOR THE MONOGRAPHIC COLLABORATORS

1. The articles sent for their publication in “Revista ICE” shall be original nor published or accepted for other publications, nor in being involved in an assessment process for another publication.
2. The contributions shall be sent in Word format to the monographic coordinator.
 - Times New Roman 12; 3 cm margin. Paragraphs with double space. A header for every epigraph, numbered in bold lower case. The pages shall be numerated correspondingly. The headers of every section shall be bold roman, while the third level shall be in cursive. The equations shall be centred and in case of being numbered justified on the right in brackets.
3. On the first page it shall appear the name and surnames, the conclusion date of the report, as well as the institutional membership of the author and the manner in which the person wants their data to be presented.
4. The extension of the report shall be from 20 to 25 pages, including graphics, tables, note and bibliography.
5. All the graphics or tables shall be numbered correspondingly, the title shall appear in the upper side and their correspondent source or footnote shall appear in the bottom left side. The documents shall be sent in separate files and in Excel format with enough technical quality. Along with the text, it will be indicated the exact position where any graphic or table shall be inserted.
6. The articles shall include an abstract compiling the most important elements, which shall not exceed 100 words. From 3 to 6 keywords shall be included, which do not coincide with the title and from 2 to 5 topics from *Journal of Economic Literature* (JEL). 7. The quotations of the books and articles in the text shall appear in parenthesis along with the author’s surname and the year. Eg.: (Martínez, 1991).
8. The footnotes shall be integrated in the text with the footnote reference in its correspondent position. The first time an acronym appears in the text it shall be fully explained.
9. The appendix shall be inserted after the bibliography. They shall be accompanied by a title and a brief explanation of their content.
10. The bibliography used shall appear at the end of the document under the name of “Referencias bibliográficas”. The shall appear in an alphabetic order following the rules of American Psychological Association Harvard-APA. Structure of the bibliography

Books: (1) Surnames, authors’ initials, (2) year of publication. (3) full title. (4) place of publication: (5) name of the publisher.

Articles: (1) Surnames, authors' initials, (2) year of publication. (3) full title in quotation marks. (4) name of the magazine (*in cursive*), (5) number and/or volume, (6) pages.

Eg.: BARNEY, J. B. (1986). "Organizational Culture: Can It Be a Source of Sustained Competitive Advantage?" Academy of Management Review, vol. 11 nº 3, pp. 656-665.

Other sources: in order to quote the documents or reports, clearly state the institution which publishes or edits the document, the date and the place of publication.

Eg.: COMISIÓN NACIONAL DE LA ENERGÍA (2013): Informe sobre el efecto del día de la semana en la determinación de los precios de los carburantes, Madrid.

Web pages: If any reference to web pages from where any document has been obtained, the full reference of the web address shall be included along with the consulting date.
